OPTIMIZE YOUR DAIRY RATION

- 1. Provide a source of clean, fresh water at all times.
- 2. For most forage programs, provide the appropriate Purina dairy mineral free-choice. Minerals should be provided in sheltered feeders.
- 3. When changing forages or milking rations, the change should be made gradually by mixing the new ration with the old ration for a period of one week.
- 4. Consult your veterinarian for recommended herd health program.
